

**NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC
IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER**

**TESI – LAKE ROYALE SUBDIVISION
PWS ID No. NC0235108**

Franklin County, North Carolina

The TESI water system listed above recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right know what happened, what you should do and what we are doing to correct the situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results for water samples collected during the time period of January 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009 show that the Running Annual Average exceeded the Standard or Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for Trihalomethanes (TTHM). The standard for TTHMs is 0.080 mg/l. The average level of TTHM over the twelve month period of April 1, 2008 thru March 31, 2009 was 0.088 mg/l.

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

There is nothing you need do at this time. You do not need to use an alternate water supply (i.e., bottled water), however if you have specific health concerns, consult your physician.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, some people who drink water containing Trihalomethanes (TTHMs) in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their livers, kidneys or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

WHAT HAPPENED? WHAT IS BEING DONE?

TTHMs are a by-product of drinking water chlorination. We have increased our schedule for sampling, and have met with and continue to work with the Franklin County Water System from which your drinking water is purchased to determine the cause of the contamination. All TTHM samples pulled since September 2008 have passed. However because the MCL was exceeded in September 2008 the RAA continues to exceed the MCL limit for the time period of April 1, 2008 thru March 31, 2009.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
